Pet tags are now expired!

2021 Pet tags expired on June 30th. Don't forget to stop in to city hall to renew your pet license for 2022! Registration fee is now \$8 per spayed/neutered dog or cat per household, and \$13 per intact dog or cat per household if renewed in July. Fee will go up to \$25 per pet each month thereafter until licensed.

This registration is to ensure all animals in town are current on their rabies vaccinations and helps to identify your pet if they are found at large instead of being taken to the Humane Society.

FIREWORKS

Fireworks may be used beginning June 24 until July 8 this year. Permitted times for use shall be from 9am until 10pm on weekdays, and 9am until 11pm on July 3 and 4. Fireworks must be used on private property and are not allowed to be used on public streets, sidewalks, or parks. Violations of these rules are considered a Municipal Infraction and will incur a \$100 civil penalty for the first offense and \$200 for each subsequent offense within 6 months. Please Remember to use caution & be safe!

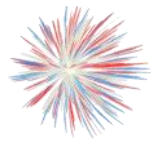

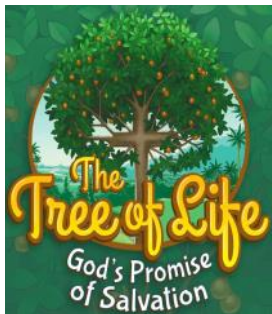

Building permits are quick and easy to complete. Permits are **required** for fences, decks, permanent sheds/buildings, concrete work, and retaining walls. Forms can be found online at lawtoniowa.com and approval can be done as quick as **24 hours!** Submission fee is only **\$15!**



The Lawton City Council has expressed their intention to sell the property located at 101 E Maple/300 Cedar St, which currently houses city hall and the Friendship Center. The city council requests anyone interested in purchasing the property submit a letter of interest to help the council plan for the future sale. This is not a formal request for proposals but will allow the council to gauge the interest in the property and determine the next course of action. Any individual or other entity with interest in the property should submit the following information: Name and contact information, Current nature of business (if applicable), planned use for the property, and a statement reflecting whether the value of the property for you intended use would exceed the expected floor value of \$200,000. Please provide your response by July 11.

*This is a request for information and not a formal bidding opportunity. The city council has not determined whether or not the sale of the property will be in the best interest of the city and may change their plan to sell the property at any time. If the council moves forward with the sale, the Iowa Code requires the council propose by resolution the method of sale, the terms, and conditions for the proposed sale, and hold a public hearing upon their proposal. For more information contact Mayor Pedersen or city hall. *All information submitted to the council is subject to the Iowa Open Records Law and will not be held as a confidential document by the city.
